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## **Introduction**

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of the Entering Student Questionnaire (ESQ) is to learn the reasons first-year students chose the University of Mount Union, and to better understand the expectations they have for their academic careers and overall university experiences.

### **Survey Administration Methods**

#### 2017-2022

The ESQ administration for academic years 2017-2022 occurred in late August at the conclusion of firstyear student orientation. Surveys were administered to first-time first-year students via SurveyMonkey by the Office of Institutional Effectiveness (OIE.) Survey links were embedded in email invitations sent directly to students. The response rate in 2017 was 53.5% but declined to 43.8% in 2017. The ESQ was not administered in 2020 and 2021 out of concern for the various disruptions students were experiencing during Covid-19. In August of 2022, there was significant return to normalcy on campus and the 2022 ESQ was administered by OIE via direct email to first-time first-year students. A participation incentive was offered in the form of four \$15.00 gift cards. The response rate for the 2022 ESQ was 20.9%.

#### 2023

The offices of Enrollment Management, Marketing, and OIE, met to discuss a change in the administration of the 2023 ESQ to increase response rates thereby providing data for a greater percentage of first-year students. It was suggested that this year, students would be given time during an orientation session to complete the ESQ. Unfortunately, scheduling constraints prevented this method of administration and survey invitations were emailed to students on October 19, two months later than in previous years. The delayed administration was discussed by all parties and determined not to be a negative factor as the questions are designed to capture information about students' application process, the desired characteristics of their university/college choices, and their expectations for academic success and overall university experience.

The ESQ was sent to 533 first-year students of whom 173 participated for a response rate of 32.5%. While this is a welcome increase from the previous year, it means we are not capturing feedback from two-thirds of entering students. The administration of the 2024 ESQ during an orientation session, when dedicated time and encouragement are provided, may have been a factor in increasing response rates from the 20.9% recorded in 2022.

## **Student Demographics**

The ESQ was sent to 533 first-year full-time students. The proceeding chart provides demographic data for this cohort by race, ethnicity, international status, and gender.

The 2023 Entering Student Questionnaire (ESQ) is composed of 11 multiple choice questions and took students approximately three minutes to complete. The responses to 10 of the questions are shown below. Question #2 asks about the types of technological devices student brought to campus is not represented below. Most response charts include data from the 2022 and 2019 surveys for comparison analyses.
