The John T. Huston—Dr. John D. Brumbaugh Nature Center Nature Photography Contest is open to amateur photographers only. An amateur is one who takes photos for pleasure rather than a source of income.

The contest is free to enter. All nature <u>photos must</u> <u>be from eastern Ohio</u> (east of Interstate 71 and Ohio Route 23). All entries meeting submission guidelines will be on display at the Nature Center through March 17.

Rules and Regulations

- All photographs must be size 8x10 and matted or securely attached to mount board. Maximum size of mat or mount board is 11x14. No glass or frames. All photographs must be on photographic quality paper.
- Photographs must not have any writing or markings on the front of the entry.
- All photographs must have the entry form attached to the back, upper left corner.
- There is a limit of <u>five entries per photogra-pher</u> and <u>three entries per category</u> except the Open category (one per photographer). Photographers must have at least one other entry to participate in the Open category. Same rules apply to youth participants.
- All entries must be received at the Huston-Brumbaugh Nature Center by 12 p.m. on Monday, February 19.
- Extreme care will be taken in handling photos, but the Huston-Brumbaugh Nature Center cannot assume liability for loss or damages.
- All entries may be picked up at the Nature Center after Monday, March 18.
- The panel of judges will consist of professional photographers and naturalists. Their decisions are final.

The John T. Huston—Dr. John D. Brumbaugh Nature Center Photo Contest and Exhibit

The contest is free to enter and open to amateur photographers. All nature photos must be from eastern Ohio (east of Interstate 71 and Ohio Route 23). All photos must be the original work of the amateur photographer. Negatives or digital files may be requested for verification purposes. Ribbons will be given in each category. Judges will designate one "Best in Show" photograph. "People's Choice" (one for each category) awards will be based on ballots cast by Nature Center visitors February 25-March 10. People's Choice winners will be announced March 12.

An open house/artist's reception will take place from 1pm—5pm on Sunday, February 25, 2024. The general public, photographers, friends and families are all invited to attend. Photographs will be formally judged and ribbons will be awarded prior to this event. The open house is free.



Category descriptions:

- Wildlife-Vertebrates (no pets, farm animals, or captive/non-releasable wildlife)
- Wildlife-Invertebrates (no captive/nonreleasable wildlife)
- Wild Plants (native/naturalized specimens)
- Landscapes

*In the above categories, humans or human activity should not be the focus of the photo.

• Seasons (photos that clearly emphasize a specific season, not just a landscape)

- Huston-Brumbaugh Nature Center (photos of or obviously taken at the Nature Center)
- UMU Campus (photos of or obviously taken on the campus of the University of Mount Union)
- Black & White (may encompass any of the above categories)
- Youth (nature photos taken by children 12 yrs old and younger)
- Open (one nature photo with no geographic restrictions—photographer must have at least 1 entry in another category to participate.)
