Introduction

The old growth forest, located on the eastern half of the trail system, is the best place to see the greatest diversity of blooming spring flowers at the Nature Center – and maybe all of Stark County. Search the edge of the Brumbaugh Woods, Beech, Oak, and Big Valley trails to find specimens of the species listed here. Bloom periods are approximate and may change depending on the progression of spring.
