

Employer Survey Results

In 2016, the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE) developed a valid survey instrument and administered it across the state for EPPs. However, due to low response rates, EPPs now administer the instrument to employers, and Ohio University collects the data and shares state means with EPPs. Due to COVID-19 and at the request of our Partner Advisory Council (which is comprised of P-12 superintendents, principals, teachers, and Educational Service Center administrators), the University of Mount Union did not administer the survey and opted to not collect data in 2021. State benchmark data for 2022 will be available in early Summer 2022 and will be added to this report at that time.

The following prompts each began with the statement, "The institution prepares its graduates to..." Survey participants responded to each prompt on a scale where 1 = Strongly Disagree, 2 = Disagree, 3 = Agree, and 4 = Strongly Agree.
