



**M.Ed. Admission Rubric
 Lawshe Content Validity Results
 Partner Advisory Council Meeting
 March 18, 2021**

During our March 18, 2021, Partner Advisory Council (PAC) meeting, we asked our members to rate how essential each item is on our M.Ed. Program Admission Rubric. Our PAC is comprised of elementary, middle, and high school principals, district administrators (curriculum directors, assistant superintendents), superintendents, and Educational Service Center (ESC) administrators. Our M.Ed. program prepares candidates to be principals in Ohio. Because our PAC members are often involved in hiring administrators, we sought their expertise on our Admission Rubric.

The Content Validity Ratio results indicated that two items on the rubric, Items 5* and 6*, were not necessary. As a result, we eliminated those questions from the assessment and began utilizing the new five-item rubric in May 2021 with incoming Principal Licensure Candidates in our M.Ed. Program.
